2. List of Dangerous Communicable Disease or Quarantinable Disease

According to the change of regulations since 1^{st} October 2022 including 1. Lifted State of Emergency Decree in respond of COVID-19 2. COVID-19 is not quarantinable disease 3. COVID-19 is no longer be contradiction for entry into the Kingdom by immigration law. These cancellations of regulations result to be the following

1. Passenger arrival formality

1.1 COVID-19 (Notifiable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry: No restriction. No document requirement before boarding to Thailand.

Upon arrival: No screening. If anyone find the case, then please notify airport clinic (not Port Health) for clinical evaluation of severe illness. Medical cost is their own shoulders.

In the Kingdom: Passenger who has been infected with COVID-19 will seek medical assistance at all clinic or hospital. The treatment is by attending physician consideration. Closed contact is no longer guarantinable.

Mask Requirement during flight: Optional.

1.2 Yellow Fever (Quarantinable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry:

- 1. Restriction for passenger who depart from 42 designated Yellow Fever countries. Please see attachment.
- 2. Prepare Yellow Fever vaccine certificate
- 3. Register online on thaihealthpass.com

Upon arrival: All passengers from those countries have to show themselves at Port Health officer to verify the YF vaccine and registry into Port Health System

In the Kingdom: Suspected YF must be isolated by law.

1.3 Monkeypox (Notifiable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry: No restriction

Upon arrival:

Symptom screening by Quarantine and Immigration Officers or Airport Staff Provide information for Monkeypox for passengers from target countries

In the Kingdom: Passenger who confirmed Monkeypox will be isolation by the clinical practice guideline.

2. Crews arrival formality

2.1 COVID-19 (Notifiable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry: No restriction. No document requirement before operation to

Thailand

Upon arrival: No screening.

In the Kingdom: Crews who has been infected with COVID-19 will seek medical assistance at airline contracted clinic or hospital. The treatment is by attending physician consideration. Closed contact is no longer quarantinable.

Mask Requirement during flight: Optional.

2.2 Yellow Fever (Quarantinable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry:

- 1. Restriction for passenger who depart from 42 designated Yellow Fever countries. Please see attachment.
- 2. Prepare Yellow Fever vaccine certificate
- 3. Register online on thaihealthpass.com once time

Upon arrival: All crews from those countries have to show themselves at Port Health officer to verify the YF vaccine and registry into Port Health System

In the Kingdom: Suspected YF must be isolated by law.

2.3 Monkeypox (Notifiable Disease by Law)

Pre-entry: No restriction

Upon arrival: Symptom screening by Officers or Airport Staff

In the Kingdom: Passenger who confirmed Monkeypox will be isolation by the clinical practice guideline.

3. Aircraft Disinfection or Disinsection

3.1 COVID-19 (Notifiable Disease by Law)

- No requirement for aircraft disinfection
- Depend on your airline standard

3.2 Yellow Fever (Quarantinable Disease by Law)

- Aircrafts operates from 42 endemic countries must provide evidence of "aircraft disinsection" to Port Health
 - Port Health will be inspection or trapping the mosquito from the aircrafts

3.3 Monkeypox (Notifiable Disease by Law)

- Recommend aircraft disinfection immediately after identify confirmed case due to highly contamination.

4. Lab testing service at arrival or transfer area

The service only in Suvarnabhumi Airport and provides

- 1. RT-PCR for COVID-19 and Monkeypox
- 2. Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) or Antigen Test (ATK) for COVID-19

5. Irregularity or Incident

- -Similar protocol before COVID-19 period
- -No necessary notify Port Health except flight from/to Africa (Yellow Fever check first)
 - -If destination still requires Lab Testing or Quarantine then consult Port Health case by case basis
 - -Communicate with immigration directly

6. Inadmissible/Deportee

- -Similar protocol before COVID-19 period
- -Not necessary notify Port Health except flight from/to Africa (Yellow Fever)
- -Communicate with immigration directly

7. Flight data or movement

-Cancel sending flight data/movement to EOC due to ending State of Emergency Decree

-Except required by regulator including Port Health, Immigration or CAAT
